



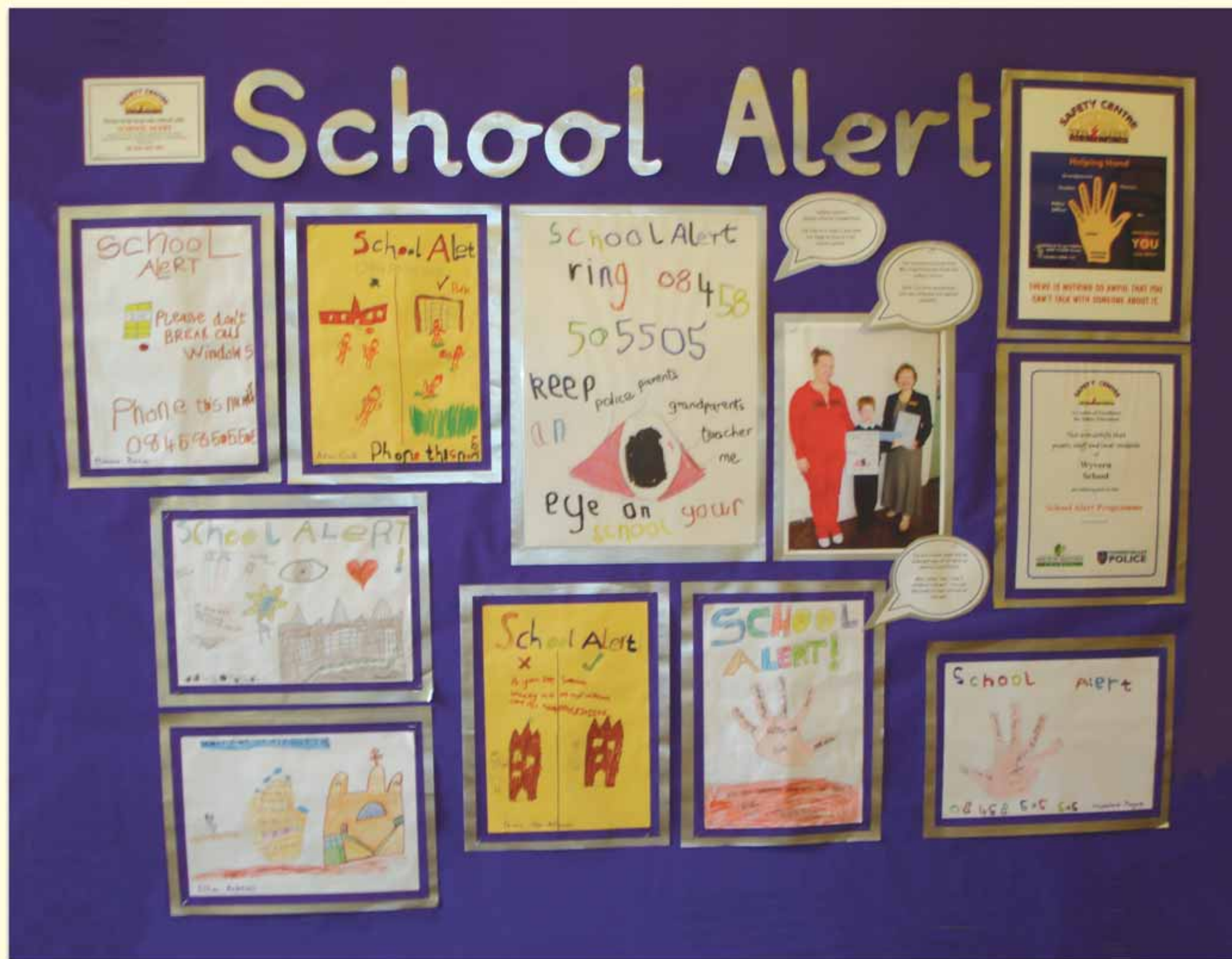
## June Paterson joins Schools Liaison Team

- Read and sign the attached registration form and return it to the Safety Centre.

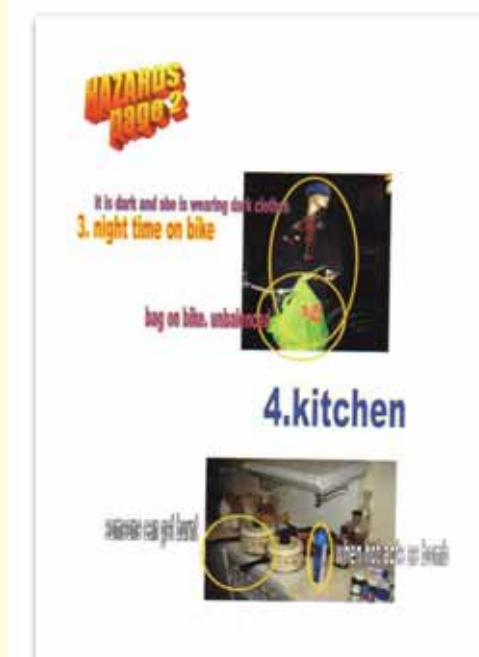
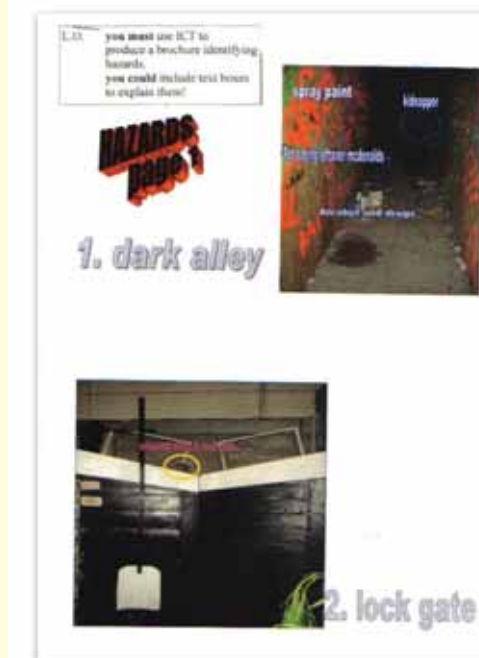
### What happens next:
